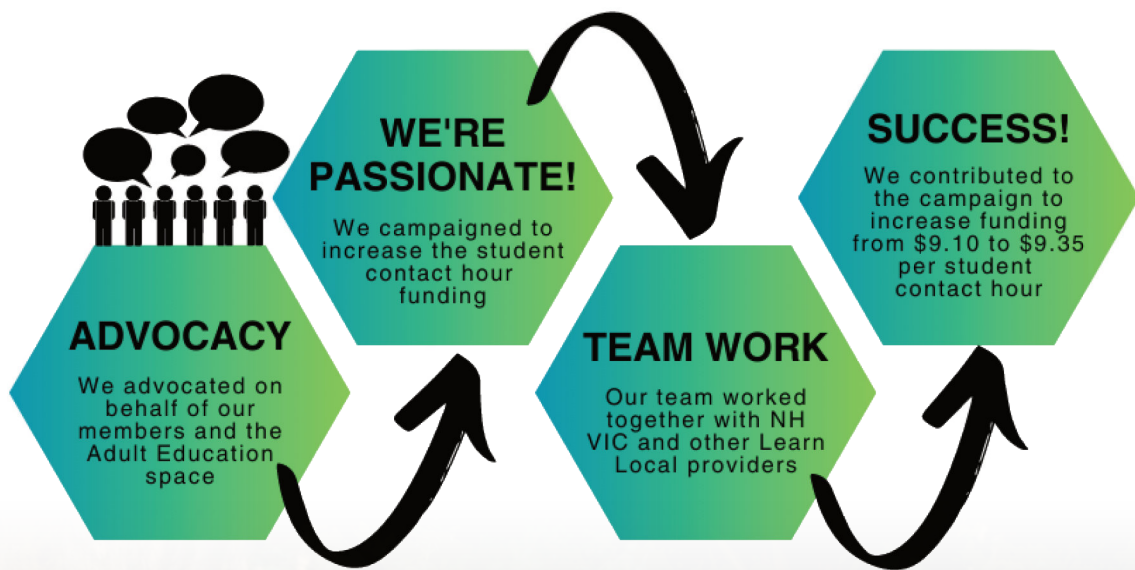

As I reflect on the year that was 2022, again we saw a year of challenges for the Learn Local sector, working in the new COVID environment and ending with flooding in many areas.

ACEVic has had a busy year providing support to the Learn Local organisations.

**This support comes in many forms and guises including:**

- Hosting member Executive Exchanges and Lunch Byte sessions
- One on one support to members on governance, budgeting, delivery, policy development, strategic planning and many many more topics
- In partnership with ALA developing and delivering sector specific education sessions for the ACFE Board, including ALNPP, ALNPP Koorie module and Pre-accredited trainer induction training
- In partnership with NHVic hosting forums and conducting sector wide surveys and providing advice on lobbying ahead of the State election
- Facilitated legal advice and subsequent repayment of Portable Long service premiums for members who fell outside of the revised regulations
- Provided submissions of sector topics including NHACE award.
- Regular meetings with ACFE Board Chair, DET executives and VSA
- Development of a new 3-year strategic plan for ACEVic to ensure continued relevance and impact

When ACEVic members choose Coverforce as their insurance provider, the commissions received have assisted to diversify income.

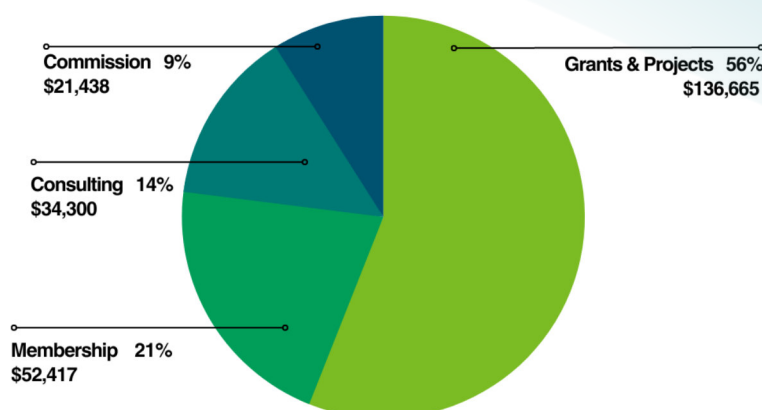

**2022 MEMBERSHIP INCOME**

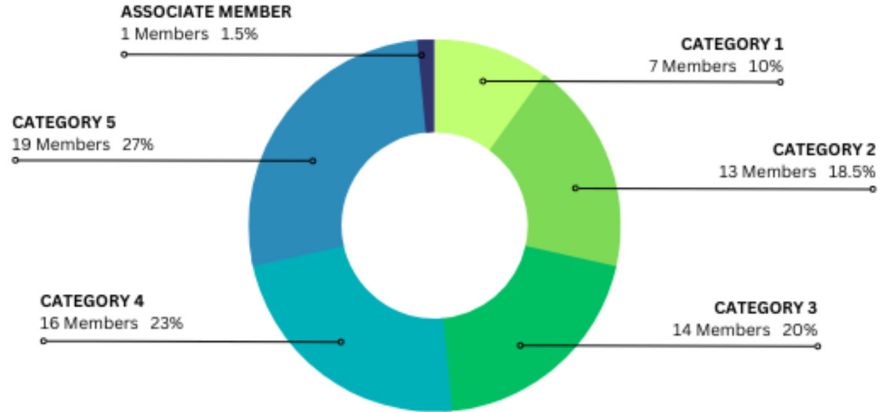


**2022 INCOME STREAMS**

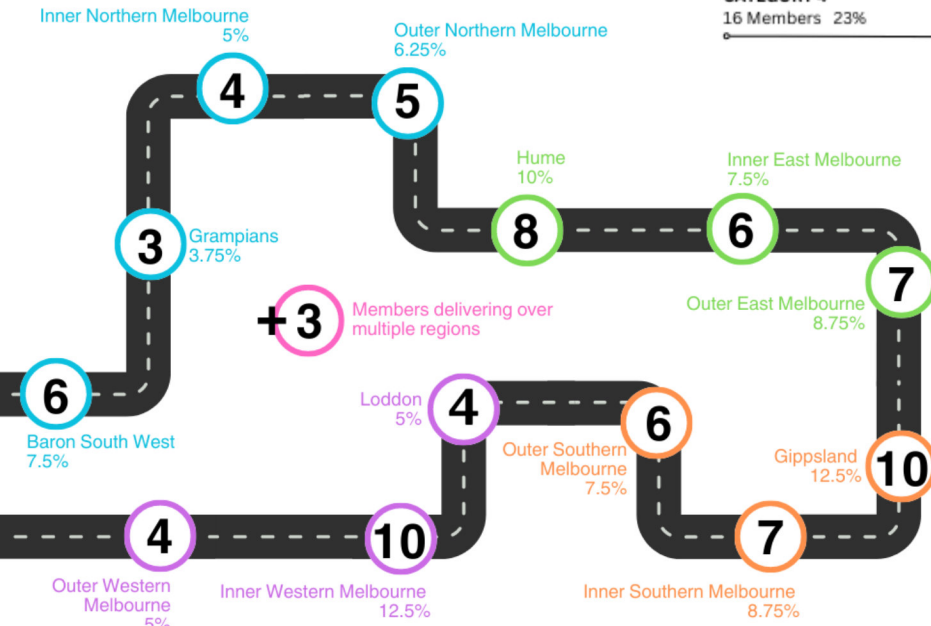



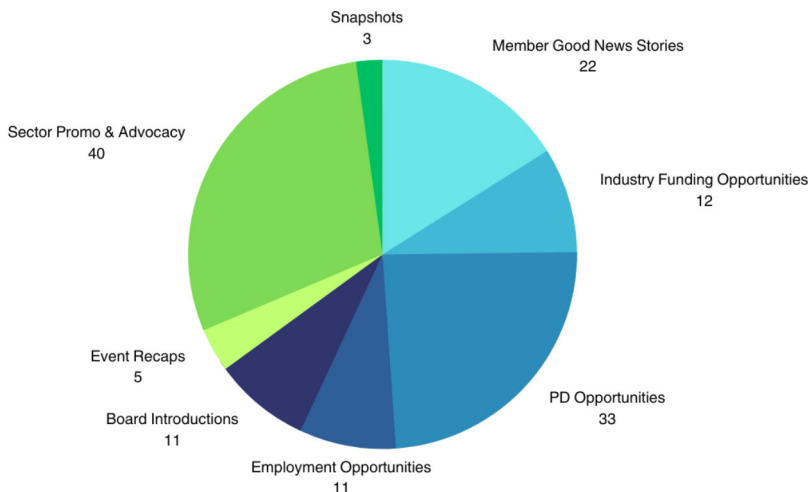
# 2022 ACHIEVEMENTS
